2010 Phase II MS4 Permit

Tennessee's Phase II Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit went on Public Notice on March 22, 2010. The Public Notice may be retrieved at the following link:

The proposed permit contains requirements for control of discharges of urban runoff from MS4s, in accordance with federal and state standards and regulations.

Permit conditions are tentative and subject to public comment. There is a nominal charge for copying permit applications, draft permits, and supporting rationale.
