

2025 TNSA Exceptional Quality Award Winners

The Tennessee Stormwater Association (TNSA) announces the 2023 "Exceptional Quality" Award Winners. TNSA recognizes individuals and stormwater professionals that have devoted time and energy into making TNSA a success and have accomplished great strides within the Tennessee stormwater arena.

Nominations were accepted by TNSA members and voted on by the TNSA Membership and Board Members. Winners were recognized at the TNSA Annual Conference on October 22, 2025 held at the Chattanoogan Hotel in Chattanooga, TN.

Person of the Year: An individual who displays Exceptional dedication and commitment to TNSA and stormwater within Tennessee.

Organization of the Year: An MS4 or other Organization that displays Exceptional stewardship of Water Quality in Tennessee and provides Exceptional education and assistance to MS4s. Individuals are not eligible for this award; only a member organization is eligible.

Dr. Bruce Tschantz Lifetime Achievement Award: TNSA's highest honor for outstanding, longtime stormwater professionals with a minimum of 20 years of service. These individuals' long-term contributions have made a noticeable impact on stormwater management efforts in the State of Tennessee. The board reviews nominations from the TNSA Membership and vote on the recipient.

Chris Masin, with Shelby County, was recognized for the Dr. Bruce Tschantz Lifetime Achievement Award this year. Chris has embodied the spirit of service to TNSA throughout his entire career. He has generously given his time and energy, always willing to lend a hand wherever needed. As a long-standing member of the TNSA Board and an active contributor to the TNSA Conference Committee, Chris has been a constant source of leadership and support. At every event, he is among the first to arrive and the last to leave, ensuring the success of the TNSA mission. His dedication and servant-hearted attitude have been unwavering for as long as we have known him.
